STANDALONE

A picture that is unrelated to the main series on the front page, such as this, is called a standalone. It will have its own headline or strap, and a longer caption than other photos. Often the story connected to the picture will be further inside the paper.

CAPTION

Captions give a brief description of a photograph or graphic. Often they include the photographer's name.

HEADLINE

The biggest headline on the page is called the "main splash".

A standfirst is used to add detail that was not included in the headline.

BYLINE

Sometimes the writer's job title or where they are writing from is included. Staff writers are always credited.

BODYTEXT

The main "body" of a news story. Often the only part written by the reporter. This text is the Observer's standard body text. The font is 9.25 point Mercury text.

TURN

Often front page stories continue elsewhere in the paper.

Vaz said: "These are shocking revelations and they demonstrate to me that an internal investigation is not enough. It's clearly the tip of the iceberg as far as these allegations are concerned and the way Serco has dealt with them."

"There needs to be an external examination following these revelations, which will look at the entire history of the allegations but also look carefully at the way in which Serco manage other properties of this kind."

One of German chancellor Angela Merkel's closest allies has firmly rejected David Cameron's proposal to extricate the UK from the EU's commitment to "ever closer union", accusing the prime minister of putting it forward in a "desperate attempt to appease Ukip".

The comments from Gunther Krichbaum, head of the German government's committee on EU affairs, will cast serious doubt on Cameron's ability to deliver on a pledge that he said a week ago was the "most important" change he wanted to see in the UK's relations with Europe.

The remarks, backed by other senior German politicians, come before Thursday's European elections in
