# Farah fury that name 'dragged through mud' in doping claim

British Olympic champion Mo Farah said yesterday that he was angry and frustrated his name had been "dragged through the mud" after his coach, Alberto Salazar, was accused of involvement in doping. But he said he would stick with the American until he sees clear evidence against him.

Farah, who won Olympic gold in the 5,000m and 10,000m a year after joining Salazar in 2011, also insisted that he was a "100% clean athlete", but feared




